Doctoral Research Grants which encourage research toward informing policymaking in the United Arab Emirates. The grant provides financial support for PhD candidates at the research element of their dissertations; these research projects must include the UAE or Ras al Khaimah in at least one part of their research.

They also offer specific grants for students from Gaza, who are currently enrolled in higher education (BA, MA or PhD), studying in accredited public universities in Jordan, Lebanon, and Egypt. As well as students from Gaza who are refugees, who face financial difficulties whilst completing their education. Currently not accepting applications for their Gaza Assistance Programme, but this is subject to change.

They include scholarships and grants for post-graduate and post-doctoral study and research scholarships. Exhibitions, lectures, conferences, archaeological excavations, conservation projects, surveys and documentation, travel grants and scholarly publications are also supported. Applicants must identify an institution to which grant monies can be transferred on their behalf.

Recipients should be at-risk for being denied education rights in their country of origin. In order to apply, students must be nominated by an institution legally domiciled in Germany.

The Eiffel Excellence Scholarship Program was established by the French Ministry for Europe and Foreign Affairs to enable French higher education institutions to attract top foreign students to enrol in their master's and PhD programs. It gives opportunity to the future foreign decision-makers of the private and public sectors, in priority areas of study, and encourages applicants from foreign countries up to 25 years old at master's level, and applicants up to 30 years old at PhD level.

Gaza Humanitarian Scholarship- The University of Leeds

The Scholarship covers full tuition fees, £10,000 towards living costs, 12 months of accommodation, and £3,500 to cover relocation costs. Applicants must have applied to a full-time postgraduate taught degree at the University of Leeds; the scholarship does not cover some postgraduate degrees and does not apply to 100% online programmes.

Gaza-Palestine Postgraduate Taught Scholarship - University of Sheffield

University of Sheffield scholarship for Master level students. The applicant must be a citizen of Gaza or having been a citizen of Gaza prior to the escalation of the conflict in October 2023. The scholarship covers the cost of tuition, accommodation in a single occupant en-suite room in university halls of residence and a maintenance award of £5,000.

Goldsmiths Humanitarian Scholarship

Provides scholarships for one year of study of taught master's programmes at Goldsmiths, University of London. This includes a full tuition waiver, a living allowance of £20,500 per year during studies, visa and travel costs. The Applicants must be Palestinian and currently residing in Palestine or be a holder of Palestinian travel documents

Goldsmith University Master level scholarship. The scholarship is open to undergraduate and postgraduate students who are Palestinian (with priority given to those who normally live in the West Bank, Gaza, or a Palestinian refugee camp. The scholarship only applies to in person courses.

The Hanoon Foundation provides support in English language learning for trainees from Gaza who do not have an overall IELTS score of 7.5, and Medicine Occupational English Test (minimum of grade B across all parts of the same test). The foundation also supports international electives, teaching fellowships, bursaries, medical equipment and undergraduate scholarships.

The PARC Tanya Baker-Asad Scholarships

The scholarship offers scholarships for Palestinian women who are pursuing humanities or social sciences PhD. The award ranges from \$5,000 to \$25,000 and may be used for degree related expenses. Applicants must be women of Palestinian heritage, and must be applying for, enrolling in or already enrolled in a PhD programme anywhere in the world at an accredited university.

Provides small emergency grants, supports asylum requests, assists with temporary relocation, and aids access to legal recourse for writers at risk. Through the Foundation PEN Emergency Fund, offers one-off grants of up to €1250 for certain emergency assistance measures.

Ulster University provides 5(subject to change) scholarships for Palestinian women at undergraduate, master's, PhD and MBBS (Graduate Entry Medicine) level. The scholarship covers full tuition fees, full accommodation, a monthly stipend, and relocation costs. To be eligible applicants must live within Palestine, however this does not apply to students who have left Gaza. The scholarship is only available for Palestinian women who have not previously studied outside Palestine, Israel or Lebanon.

Saïd Foundation Scholarship

The Saïd Foundation offers scholarships for one-year master's degree courses in the UK. There are no subject restrictions, but the applicant should demonstrate that the subject will allow them to make contribution to the development of their home country. Applicants must apply to the Saïd Foundation's partner universities or explain in their application form why they have chosen a non-partner university. Applicants must have Syrian, Jordanian, Lebanese or Palestinian nationality (please see the website for more information on eligibility.)

The scholarship covers full tuition fees, accommodation fees, maintenance funding, and relocations costs.

The Foundation offers various research grants and dissertation fellowships. Highest priority is given to proposals from any of the natural and social sciences and the humanities that promise to increase the understanding of the causes, manifestations, and control of violence and aggression in the modern world. Priority will also be given to areas and methodologies not receiving adequate attention and support from other funding sources. Applicants may be citizens of any country and studying at a college or university in any country, with the exception of the Harry Frank Guggenheim African Fellows programme which is restricted to doctoral-candidate researchers from the African continent.

Human Frontier Science Program (HFSP Fellowship Program)

The HFSP programme supports research projects in the life sciences. The programme offers long-term fellowships, for applicants who have a PhD in a biological topic, and a Cross Disciplinary Fellowship for applicants with a non-biological PhD degree (such as physics or maths) with little or no life sciences experience.

Netherlands Institute for Advanced Study in the Humanities and Social Sciences (NIAS) - Safe Haven Fellowship Programme

The Safe Haven Fellowship Programme offers temporary relocation to journalists, writers and artists who are unable to continue their work due to state or non-state actors. NIAS also encourages applications from individuals who have faced restrictions to academic freedom. The Fellowship programme offers a 5-month fellowship, a stipend, subsidised housing, and support for travel costs.

The Palestinian American Research Centre (PARC) Research Fellowships in Palestinian Studies

Research fellowship competition for Palestinian doctoral students and Palestinian scholars who have earned their PhD. Proposed research must contribute to Palestinian Studies Research and must take place in Palestine, Jordan, or Lebanon.

The Pause Programme

The programme co-funds a higher education or research institution placement. Support lasts from 6 months to a year. Applicants must be doctoral students (with who have an in-progress thesis that has been disrupted by an urgent situation), researcher, teacher-researcher or artist teacher in their country of origin. Additionally, applicants must be at-risk (please see programme website for more details on eligibility).

Palmed Academy - Gaza Educate Medics (GEM)

The scheme offers curriculum aligned medical education through online platforms for medical students in Gaza. Palmed also offers courses to help advance medical careers for Palestinians in the UK through webinars and courses. The website also lists a series of fellowships across Europe for Palestinian Medical students.

Protective Fellowships for Human Rights Defenders - University of York

Offered by the Centre for Applied Human Rights, these three-to-six-month fellowships consist of an invitation of benefiting human rights defenders to come to York, to both enhance their skills and take time to recuperate before returning to their work. The Fellowships include a 6-month Protective Fellowship Scheme for Human Rights Defenders and a 3-month Protective Writing Fellowship for Human Rights Defenders. Applications may only be made by a nominating organisation such as a recognised civil society organisations and inter-governmental organisations working in human rights or with human rights defenders.

Virtual Scholar Scheme- The University of Exeter

Preference is given to artists who can demonstrate accomplishment and promise in their artistic practice and will benefit their home countries or communities. Applicants cannot be seeking to use funds for the continuation of academic studies and should not have been displaced or in exile for more than two years.

This includes the Gene Roberts Emergency Fund Journalist Assistance program, which offers emergency grants to journalists in distress worldwide.

The Reporters Respond fund provides direct assistance, legal support, and safety advice to journalists and media outlets in need to enable them to resume their work. This includes subsistence costs for journalists who are not able to work or need to flee an unsafe situation, and temporary support for family members of journalists who are unable to work, imprisoned, or deceased. Freelance or staff journalists are eligible if their emergency situation is a direct result of their work in journalism.

International Federation of Journalists Safety Fund

The Fund offers financial assistance for journalists facing emergency situations such as threats, violence, prosecution, exile, and illness.
